

Quick Guide to PsycInfo

The **PsycInfo database** is available through the CSA Illumina interface at UCB, along with PsycArticles and Psychology: Sage Full-Text. These three databases provide an index to scholarly journal articles, books, dissertations and other documents in the field of psychology.

Coverage

PsycInfo, produced by APA (American Psychological Association), indexes over 8 million cited references in over 185,000 journals (including both peer-reviewed and non-peer-reviewed), books and chapters. **Dates of coverage** include 1806 to the present, with approximately 60,000 new records added yearly. Over 2,167,174 records had been added as of October 2005.

Where to Start

The CSA Illumina link to PsycInfo on the Education Psychology Library website (www.lib.berkeley.edu/EDP) connects to the interface that includes PsycInfo, PsycArticles and Psychology: Sage Full-Text. From the UC Berkeley Library website (www.lib.berkeley.edu) click on Electronic Resources, then on Subjects A-Z, choose Psychology, then click on PsycInfo or the CSA Illumina link to all CSA social science databases. For more information about any of the databases, click the “?” beside its name.

Search Clear

Primary search fields include title, author, source (i.e., publication title), authors’ affiliation, descriptors (i.e., APA’s subject headings), abstract, references, tests and measurements, among others. Click the drop-down arrow in the field box for a complete list. The initial screen defaults to Keywords (searches the Abstract field), Title, and Anywhere (searches all fields). The Tests and Measurements field can be used to find citations to literature that refer to a specific psychological test or scale.

Begin the Search by entering your terms, i.e., subject, keywords, title, author, publication name, name of test or scale in the search boxes. Be sure to click the drop-down arrow to identify which field you want the search engine to search to find your term. Note that more rows can be added for additional search terms by clicking the “Add Row” link. Also, choose a Boolean connector, i.e., and, or, not, to connect each row of terms.

APA Thesaurus

For help finding additional terms and descriptors, consult the APA Thesaurus. Print editions of the Thesaurus are found in the library reference areas, call number BF43.T45. An online version of the Thesaurus can be found by clicking on the “Search Tools” tab on the opening CSA screen. Click on Thesaurus, select the PsycInfo Thesaurus, and enter your search term. The Thesaurus will display the term along with broader, narrower and/or related terms if you click the “Hierarchy” button.

Quick Guide to PsycInfo

Display Results

- Search results display in “Most Recent First” order. You can also sort by Relevance.
- Select sub-tabs to limit your results to peer-reviewed journals, books, or click “More” for other categories.
- Note the display of descriptors to the right of the citation. Click on the links for more articles indexed with a particular descriptor. Note you will not get a subset of the original results, but an entirely new set of results.
- To see the full abstract of an article, click “View Record”.
- Beginning in 2001, PsycInfo began to add reference lists to the View Record page. Many references are hotlinked to abstracts, online full-text, and to records of publications that cite them.

Find Full-Text at UC Berkeley

Save, Print, Email, or Create a Bibliography

After clicking on the boxes next to the record numbers of the citations you want to select, click on [Save, Print, Email](#) at the top of the results screen. Be sure the records selected are indicated, then select the format desired. Scroll down the screen to select “Email”, “Save” (to disk) or “Print Preview”. To create a quick bibliography, select the “Create” button after checking to see that APA Style is chosen.

Refworks

CSA seamlessly links to Refworks, a citation software program available via all UCB terminals and via off-campus proxy access. Click on the [Export to RefWorks](#) button on the bottom of the Save, Print, Email page or click on [RefWorks](#) directly from the search results page to export a list of selected citations to your own Refworks database. Refworks allows you to quickly format citations in APA style both in a bibliography and within a manuscript.
